floatable length.

0.0 Stubblefield Access on left, on County Road 1195 off Hwy 248. No ramp. Gravel launch area.

2.0 Steel bridge at south edge of village of Jenkins. Access.

2.1 Jenkins Creek on left.

2.8 Hwy. 248 Bridge. No access.

5.5 Old mill-dam site.

7.3 Rockhouse Creek on right.

7.6 Hwy. 39 Bridge. Access.

9.3 Ford. Cato 1 mile west.

13.8 Route EE Bridge and Lower Flat Creek Access on right. Gravel bar. No ramp.


15.3 Carney Creek on left.


19.3 Concrete bridge on County Road 76-100, off Hwy. 76. Access. Table Rock lake fishing regulations apply below this point.

23.8 Dry Creek on left, off Hwy. 173. Access.

24.4 Table Rock Reservoir may back lake water to this point.

26.0 Hwy. 173 Bridge. Access on right.
