## Little Piney Creek

This tributary of the Gasconade is fed by many small springs, is a good fly-fishing stream and is frequently floatable with some wading. The lower 7.5 miles provide the best floating. The upper 10 miles is has a lower gradient and less water.

Difficulty: I and II.

Gradients: Hwy. 63 to Beaver Creek — 8.2; to

Gasconade River — 9.4.

0.6 Lane Spring has a daily flow of several million gallons. Lane Spring Recreation Area (Forest Service) and campground. Enter from Hwy. 63 east of river, on FS Road 1892.

7.3 Access and Forest Service Recreation Area at end of County Road 7400 on left.

12.0 Beaver Creek on right.


14.7 Newburg Bridge on Route T. Access at gravel bar below bridge on right.
