Mississippi River

The Mississippi River has as much or as little as you're prepared to float. Department of Conservation areas, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) accesses, and river town waterfronts all combine to give floaters a spectrum of opportunities. Unlike the river miles of other waterways featured here, this publication uses mileage established by USACE for both the Mississippi River and Missouri River maps.

This section highlights accesses and points of interest from Hannibal to just downriver of the Melvin Price Locks and Dam, approximately 5 miles upriver of the confluence of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers. All of the accesses, conservation areas, and landmarks noted are on the Missouri side (floater's right) of the river. 
