
Roaring River


Roaring River is actually a small creek, but it is fed by Roaring River Spring that has had recorded flows of between 10 and 108 cubic feet per second. This, with the addition of local run-off, can make the stream floatable, and sometimes relatively exciting. Roaring River Hatchery, located in Roaring River State Park (DNR), produces trout that are released into the stream. In some areas of Roaring River and into Table Rock Lake, special fishing regulations apply. Roaring River State Park offers campgrounds, cabins, and an inn.

Difficulty: II, very little III.

Gradient: 15.4 County: Barry.

- 0.0 Access below restricted fly-fishing area of Roaring River State Park. Camping. Route F parallels the river for the first 2.5 miles.
- 1.5 Roaring River Conservation Area and access on left. Parking lot is 0.2 mile from river, so must carry boats.
- 3.0 Muncey Bridge. No access.
- 3.6 Ford access.
- 4.6 Low-water bridge access. Table Rock Lake boundary.
- 5.8 Eagle Rock village and Hwy. 86 Bridge access. Lake backwater begins about 0.25 mile downstream.
